Homeland Security program's students check out security-related R&D

Students interested in science and technology careers, with application relying on to homeland security, are getting a head start at ORNL this summer by participating in the Department of Homeland Security Scholarship and Fellowship program.

Organized through the Oak Ridge Institute for Science and Education, the diversity of this year's seven participants reflects the diversity of disciplines integral to DHS objectives. Collectively, the students are studying chemical and mechanical engineering, mathematics, chemistry, computer science and linguistics.

All of the students applied in 2004, two as graduate students remaining for the second of three years, one first-year graduate fellow, one student is returning after an industry graduate scholarship, and four undergraduates are in the second of two summers.

"The scholarships and fellowships awarded to students pay for school, and the students are required to do a 10-week internship at a DHS-funded or DHS-approved project," says DHSI Project Manager Sam Field, who oversees the participants' safety training, housing, transportation and logistical issues.

After applying for and being accepted into the program, the students travel to Washington, D.C. for an introduction, DHS briefing and a

roundup of the summer projects in which they can participate.

"It's kind of a reverse, matching up those that want to do the work with those that want them to do the work," Field says.

The purpose of the internship is to prepare students for research fields that are relevant to homeland security applications and encourage participating students to seek a career with the DHS.

"If they offer us a job, obviously we're going to be excited," says North Carolina State University computational and applied mathematics graduate student Stacy Eitzinger, adding that the students, however, are not under any obligation to accept a job offer or become employed by the DHS.

Calvin Sackler, a Valparaiso University senior in mechanical engineering, says that an interest in furthering the goals of the DHS is an important prerequisite for applicants.

"That's never false," Sackler says. "If you're not interested in homeland security, you're not interested in the program." (See SECURE, page 1)

Leeches, not beaches: Summer campers explore science

Leeches, not beaches, are the focus of an all-inclusive, 10-day, sixth and seventh grade summer camp at ORNL. Campers are spending their time in wetland science, field painting, squid dissection and bug catching.

The annual ORNL Science Explorer Camp focuses on a variety of interactive field experiences that cover a diversity of scientific topics. Imagine Bill Nye meets Nuke in a greenhouse and you've got a pretty good picture of a day in the life of the science explorers.

Being an Explorer Haley Whitaker of Knoxville wants to be "a scientist or an oceanographer," so she looks right at home pouring the tips of a wood fish to apply green acrylic paint lipstick with a spoon.

"Don't put a really, do painting. I've seen dead things before," Haley says.

Whitaker's doing — painting the body of a gray triggerfish and giving a sister on top of it to make a print — is one of the many hands-on activities that the students took part in during the two-week-long camp.

Orlando teacher Steve Oliver's background is nearly as diverse as the kids' activities, be-

holds degrees in mathematics, statistics, computer science, geology and physics, in painting illustrative activities at light activity, relaxation and movies and personal and kinetic energy was a piece of cake.

"We fill this basin with salt water and hang a wire over the surface so that the toy is suspended in the middle of the container," Oliver says, demonstrating an electrostatic current and magnetism activity. "There are 100 magnets across from each other in the basin, and the campers can watch them move when we flip the switch here, and see the forces in motion."

"I agree with this group, we don't use the word force," Oliver explains, with a twinkle in his eye.

Avoiding using a word is probably a good idea — the campers are all pretty young, wilded themselves. Even a bunch full of giggling 10-year-old girls sings to attention when Keri Light, another science camp leader, calls for them on the day's book about aquatic life.

"Oh, oh, read those lectures," says one of the girls, who a moment earlier had been

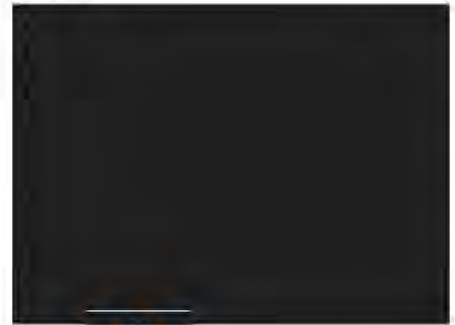

Fischer was previously the Director of Technology Transfer and Economic Development for UT-Battelle at the Oak Ridge National Laboratory (ORNL) where he oversaw tremendous growth in commercialization activities, the development of a new Science and Technology Park on the ORNL campus, the implementation of a technology-focused venture capital fund with local business leaders, and the launch of the successful Global Venture Challenge business plan competition.


Before joining Battelle, Fischer served as the Deputy Governor and Chief of Staff to Tennessee Governor Don Sundquist. In this position, he served as the principal advisor to the Governor on all matters of the State of Tennessee including the oversight of the 22 agencies of state government.

Prior to his service as Deputy Governor, Fischer served as the Commissioner of the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development (ECD). During Fischer's tenure, the State of Tennessee set numerous economic development investment records including more than \$40 billion of new capital investment and was named "State of the Year" for its economic development accomplishments.

During his service in state government, Fischer acted as the primary state-liaison in the development of the successful bid by the University of Tennessee and Battelle for the \$5 billion management contract for the Oak Ridge National Laboratory.

Fischer was the co-founder of Comprehensive Community Care, a behavior health company, the Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer of Akins and Tombras Public Relations, the founding Executive Director of Technology 2020 (a technology incubator in Oak Ridge, Tennessee) and the Director of Planning for the Tennessee Technology Foundation.

A native of Hendersonville, Tennessee, Fischer graduated from the University of Tennessee in



Knoxville with a bachelor's degree in business administration and a master's degree from the school of Architecture and Planning. He has been honored with several community service awards including the Ernst & Young Supporter of Entrepreneurship of the Year and Postman Medal for his outstanding leadership in Business and Government. Alex and his wife Lori, a Commissioner of the Ohio Civil Rights Commission, have three children and reside in the city of Columbus.

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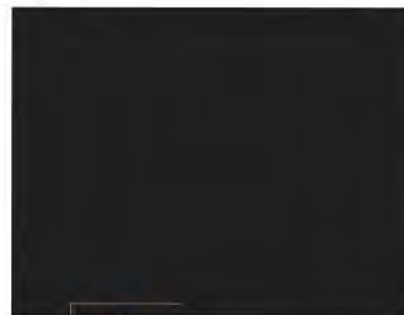
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
