S.F. WOMAN BACKS LONDON MILITANTS

Miss Troy Enlists Aid of Titled American Women for Suffragettes.

LONDON, March 29 [, 1913] – Mrs. H.R. Emerson of Detroit, Mich., assisted by Miss Lillian Scott-Troy of San Francisco, is trying to enlist several American women married to titled Englishmen to obtain the release of Miss Zelie Emerson from Holloway jail, where she is imprisoned for breaking windows.

Miss Emerson, who stated a "hunger strike," has suffered much from forcible feeding.

It is hoped by Miss Emerson that the support of the Duchess of Marlborough, who was Miss Consuelo Vanderbilt, will be obtained. The Duchess is a suffragist.

The United States embassy cannot take any steps unless instructed by Washington, because Miss Emerson is treated as are English women.

The militant suffragists think Home Secretary McKenna is susceptible to pleas on perfumed note paper market with a coronet and they believe a few such letters might open the prison doors for the young American crusader.

Says Condition Is Bad.

Mrs. Emerson is much distressed about her daughter's condition. She obtained permission to visit her and said afterward:

"Her condition is extremely bad. While she has a stronger constitution than most of those who have undergone the same ordeal, I greatly fear her health will be permanently impaired."
