Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 11 day of Oct, anno Domini 1920, and in the State of New York, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 11 day of Oct, anno Domini 1920, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.
