## STATE BUDGET PASSED, GOES TO CONFERENCE

Assembly Clears Way for Swift Action on Measure

EXAMINER BUREAU, SACRAMENTO, March 22. Opposition forces threw in the towel today and the assembly passed Governor Warren's 1950-51 State budget.

Both houses now have passed their own version of the measure, which totals \$3,742,594, when it came from the Governor's desk. The Assembly vote was 65 to 12, with George D. Collins of San Francisco among the Democrats dissenting.

**WAY CLEARED.** — The lower house's budget committee cleared the way for speedy reference of the Senate's budget to a special committee by amending the assembly version of the budget into the bill passed by the Senate.

Senator William P. Rich, finance committee chairman, said the Senate will postpone action on the committee to get this special measure cleared.

Collier's bill was passed at the last minute on Dec. 18. The proposed substitute is sponsored by the joint interim committee on lobbying, headed by Assemblyman L. E. Erwin, Puerto Rican.
