When was that? A When I first came to the Chickasaw Nation I was traveling, twelve yearsago and took, pictures all around this country.

Q You claim intermarried rights in the Choctaw Nation? A Yes; I reside in the Chickasaw.

Q What is the name of your Indian wife? A Nettie West.

Q Is she a recognized and enrolled citizen of the Choctaw Nation? A Yes, sir.

Her rights have never been questioned? A No, sir.

When were you first married to Nettie West? A In '93. Q Where was this marriage ceremony performed? A Down on the River near Frances.

Q In the Chickasaw Nation? A Yes, sir.

Did you procure a marriage license? A Yes, sir.

- From the tribal authorities? A From the United Statesauthority in 1893.
- In 1893 you were married under United States license? A Yes, sire

Q Did you remarry this woman? A Yes, sir.

At that time of your marriage howlong had you been a resident of the Chickasaw Nation, you and your wife? A At the timeof my second marriage I had lived one year in the Choctaw Nation, the first year after I was married and then I came back to the Chickasaw Nation and lived there two years.

Were you ever married before your marriage to Nettie West? A No,

sir. Was she ever married before her marriage to you? A No, sir.

Since your first marriage in L893 have you lived together continuously as husband and wife? A Yes, sir.

There has been no separation, abandonment or divorce? A No, sir.

Are you at present living together as bonafide residents of the Chickasaw Nation? A Yes, sir. --- At the time of my first marriage I had not lived in the Territory but a shorttime and according to Indian law could not procure any license and after the espiration of a particular time, according to law, I went and secured the Indian license and married according to Indian law.

It appears from the record herein that James R. Chandler, on October 5, 1896, was married in accordance with the laws, customs and usages of the Chickasaw Nation to Nettie Chandler (nee West), a recognized and enrolled citizen by blood of the Choctaw Nation, whose name appears as No. 45 upon the lists prepared by this Commission under the Act of Congress approved July 1, 1902 (32 Stats., 641) of persons entitled to enrollment as citizens by blood of the Choctaw Nation and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on December 12, 1902; that at the time of said marriage both persons above mentioned were residents in good faith of the Chickasaw Nation, and that they have lived together continuously in Indian Territory as husband and wife from the date of said marriage up to and including September 25, 1902.

It is, therefore, the opinion of this Commission that James R. Chandler should be enrolled as a citizen by intermarriage of the Choctaw Nation under the provisions of the Acts of Congress approved June 28, 1898 (30 Stats., 495), and July 1, 1902 (32)

Stats., 641), and it is so ordered.
